



Hearts and Flowers: In Memoriam

HERTA ATZELSBERGER July 30, 1926- September 28, 2019

On September 28, 2019 our oldest founding 35 year members, passed away in her sleep at the hospital after having a mild stroke two days before, at her retirement home.

Herta was a very active member of TWS for many years. In the first year she was the social chair and then took on the massive job of being the head of the Telephone Committee.

In the days before the internet this was our only means of communicating with our large membership between our quarterly newsletters.

Herta and assistant Katherine Anne Boyd, had the largest committee in all of in TWS and it was a very big job. For her dedication to this job, Herta was one of the first five recipients in 2000-2001, of the Executive Volunteer Contribution Award that was initiated by then President Olja Mueller.

During our 25th Anniversary year she was presented with her 25 year member Pin and a Certificate and was nominated by TWS to receive her 25 pin and certificate from the Ontario Government for significant contribution to the Arts in Ontario.

She was awarded this award with 5 other TWS nominees at a special presentation at Arcadian Court in Toronto. She was also awarded Volunteer of the year award. In 2011 she also was awarded her Lifetime membership award.

Herta was a very friendly member who rarely missed a meeting. Because of her position on the executive she knew most members. Because of illness Herta stepped down from her position as Telephone Committee in 2011.

Herta originally lived in Czechoslovakia became very proficient in 8 different languages. Because of the war she moved a number of times and lived for 2 years in Vienna where she was accepted.

Because she was very good in drawing and design, she was accepted into the prestigious "Fashion School of the City of Vienna" After the war she met her husband Karl where they emigrated to Canada and were married in 1953. Herta designed her own wedding dress and necklace as well as her daughter's wedding dress wedding dress when she married.

In addition to her art, she did embroidery on Shriners fezzes and aprons. Later she also designed fezzes for Shriners in the U.S. and was highly praised for her work. Being a stay at home mother, Herta was able to volunteer at her local hospital for 20 years. Herta was a wonderful giving woman and a very special person to many in TWS and so many others who crossed her path in life

The funeral service was held on Sat Oct 26th at Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Uxbridge and she was interned at Pine Hill Cemetery in Scarborough. She leaves behind a son and daughter and their families including 2 grandchildren and 2 greatgrand children. Her husband of 65 years predeceased her in May 2019. There was no obituary in the newspaper. Jenny Reid and Pat McFarland of TWS attended the funeral.

She leaves behind 4 children, 8 grandchildren and one sister as well many friends in the art world. Her funeral was held at Yorkminster Park Baptist Church where she had exhibited work in the past. She was interned at Mt Pleasant Cemetery.



Although the actual subject for your paintings will rely on your imagination, you are requested to bring 6-12 landscape type photos to serve as stimuli.




TWS Membership Online Renewal Instructions

The new interim website can be found at tws-art.weebly.com. This is what the home page of the new website looks like:




How do I renew my membership online?






This page has instructions on how to complete your membership renewal. Membership renewal is a **three-step** process:




Note: Lifetime Members will have received their coupon code via email or at a TWS meeting. This is a one-time code, after use it is no longer valid and provides a discount on the membership.
