November was an unusual month this year. I had planned a visit to my parents in San Diego for a few days, to help with some of their annual chores and to help sort through some of the clutter that they have accumulated over 20 years of owning a condo in California. They are snowbirds, and spend their winters in San Diego. It's been their second home city for years; in 1977 my family moved to San Diego for a year so that my father could do a sabbatical study at UCSD. They have been visiting ever since.

When my mother emailed Nov 1st to say that my father had fallen and broken his hip, the trip to San Diego became more urgent, and I had to fly down a few days earlier than expected.

I am lucky that I can live my life and support myself as a professional artist. I spend my days working at painting, something I love to do, and often it feels like I am not working at all. My priority has been to make art, and figure out how to sell it. But family takes priority over everything. My father was in hospital for a week, and in a rehab facility for another week in San Diego. It took us two weeks to figure out a way to get him back to Canada. He arrived here November 15, and spent two more weeks in rehab in Toronto. He is back at home now, and maneuvering his way around. It is so good to have him back in Toronto. Not only am I lucky to have both my parents, I am so happy that I am able to help.

His accident puts everything in perspective. I am lucky that it was just a broken hip. It makes me realize what a great country we live in with an amazing health system. It makes the making of art less important. And it makes the role of president of the TWS seem so too. I am grateful for the executive TWS members that pitched in during my absence. Thank you.

Debra Tate-Sears is a Kingston area artist. Her unique approach to watercolour and egg Tempera is influenced by early 19th Century British landscape painters and the cultural history of Canadian Architecture.

Debra uses a precise, stylized examination of architectural elements in the landscape, and combine this with the principles of the "Romanic" composition. The result is often brooding and dark, but at the same time strangely inviting.

Debra employs a dry brush approach to the watercolour medium that also translates well to an interpretation of the ancient medium of egg tempera.

Maurice is an elected member of the Canadian Society of Painters in Watercolour (CSPWC) and the Ontario Society of Artists (OSA).




