Happy New Year! I hope this greeting finds you full of resolution for a creative year and inspired to welcome the "new" going forward as we all cherish memories of the past.

Our Aquavision 34th Annual Fall Juried Show opened on December 9 and runs until January 17. There is still time to bring your friends and family to see the show. Congratulations to all the artists who were selected for the exhibit. **Tony Saldutto's** leadership as our Show Chair is very much appreciated.

Our membership renewal period for 2019-2020 runs from mid-January to the end of February. The renewal fee of \$85 applies during this period. Late renewals with a penalty charge of an extra \$20 will be accepted from March 1 to 31, 2019. With our website renewal initiative ongoing, we will follow the same process as last year, with a PDF renewal form available to download and online payment available via PayPal on the TWS website. As a back-up, we'll send around the renewal form by e-mail and you may pay online or by cheque. If you do not have access to a computer, you have the option of completing the renewal form included in this newsletter and sending it with your cheque to the new TWS postal address.

Sincere thanks to volunteer **Phyllis Pollard** who did the legwork to establish our new TWS postal address at the Sheppard Centre. This saves individuals from having to post their personal addresses on the Internet to receive forms and payments from members. Phyllis will check the postal box regularly and distribute mail received.

Volunteerism is an essential part of the success of TWS. If you're new to the Society, I encourage you to find an area of interest and get involved. Most of the long-standing members have been actively involved for years. You'll note that we are asking everyone to **commit to at least two volunteer activities** on the membership renewal form. Our Committee Chairs will contact volunteers to build their committees and support activities. Please answer their call and get involved.

I am looking forward to spending time with you at our monthly meetings, shows and workshops. The renewal requirement of attendance at four meetings or a combination of meetings and a workshop or the July paint-out has been discontinued. We trust our members will keep attending the monthly meetings and events to meet others and enjoy the program we organize for our community of artists.

We are busy planning for ways to celebrate our 35th Anniversary and welcome **Farid Ahmadi** as Chair of that committee. Send Farid your ideas—his contact information is on the Executive Contacts list at the end of this newsletter.

Welcome **Tracey Narduzzi**, our new website coordinator, who has been doing a wonderful job of keeping our website up to date!

A big thank you to **Terri Flaser** for leading the organization of the Holiday Party. The food was abundant, the talented artists battled with their brushes, the miniatures were lively, and the company sublime!

Over the past year, I have experienced many positive exchanges with new volunteers on the various committees. Their willingness to take on tasks in a spirit of helpfulness is so reassuring. The year ahead for me will bring many changes and I am determined to get better at delegating.

Change of Society Policy

The stipulation to attend four meetings during a year has been a bylaw component for membership in the society since it was started almost 35 years ago. It was also the essential requirement needed for membership renewal. There were several reasons for this. It was imperative that people signing on were truly interested in the activities of the group and would be "hands-on" in all that the society had to offer.

The appeal of the Society quickly brought many requests for membership. Our first meeting location at Hodgson Public School had limited space for our meetings. When we moved to the auditorium of the North York library, our membership was able to increase. However, the library rules limited the number of people permitted to assemble in their space. As requests to join the Society continued, this restriction resulted in a long waiting list for membership. Our current meeting location, Burgundy Rooms A and B, has more space and a larger occupancy capability.

During the last few years many long- time members had to relinquish their membership. Many cited the inability to get to meetings as they were no longer able to drive at night. Some had to deal with illness both personally or that of loved ones. It was sad to see these people go as they were so active and supportive through many years. Adjusting the four- meeting rule to permit substituting a workshop or the July paint-out has helped, but it seemed that we were not providing options to these long-time members when their role as society participants changed.

After much thought and discussion, the Board of Directors has decided to abolish the four- meeting commitment as a requirement for TWS membership and highlight volunteering instead. Current members may now apply for renewal of their membership irrespective of their attendance record for last year.

This major policy change will make the society more inclusive, allowing all members of varied circumstances to continue their association and enjoyment that comes with membership.

An exquisite landscape with confident and sensitive brushwork and a colour palette at times subtle, other times bold, but always showing a great understanding of colour relationships. While the painting evokes the Group of Seven, the presentation (of paper mounted to canvas, varnished and framed without glass) is a wonderfully contemporary way to show watercolours.

Construction

Bold geometry, sophisticated colour palette, clean edges, precise paint application in this Constructivist inspired composition that keeps our eye moving around, shows skillful hierarchy and a balance between a sense of detail in the finer lines with the drama of the bolder ones. The angles, direction changes, tensions between the curved and the straight and of course applications of colour are carefully and skillfully used in this non-objective composition.



WORKSHOPS

Jacintha Krish November 10 and November 11, 2018

Our November workshop was taught by Jacintha Krish. Jacintha has a knack of introducing bold colours and strokes to her art – her message throughout the 2 days was to use your imagination rather than copying the reference photograph and to paint every day. I got the distinct impression that Jacintha loves the process of painting.

On November 10th: Jacintha demonstrated 2 florals in watercolours and then introduced strong lines with ink to her finished work. She also demonstrated how to adhere a watercolour painting onto a birch panel to make the painting very contemporary and easy to hang without framing. Even though this is currently not accepted in our show; it certainly is an excellent way to present your work and be able to sell it at a much better price than standard custom framing. On Sunday Jacintha demonstrated a landscape in acrylics; and she infused a snow scene with warmth and colour. In honour of November 11th; she also demonstrated red poppies.

Our venue did not have heat, but despite this, participants came back for the second day a little more warmly dressed than for first day.

Workshop # 2 (May 9-10) has a few spots left for participants. Don't delay as there are only 8 spots remaining.


Our maximum is 25 and I have already had enquiries from many non members across the country.



On Saturday October 27th, at the Richmond Hill Centre for the Performing Arts, I had the great honour, along with Andrew Sookrah, of painting to Rachmaninov 's "Isle of the Dead". This was a live interpretation of the music played by the Richmond Hill Philharmonic Orchestra. The whole concert, "Symphonic Watercolours" was a special titled culmination of the International Watercolour Society of Canada, and the Canadian Society of Painters in Watercolour of a month long exhibit of over 150 finalists of watercolours from over 80 countries around the world. I also had the great honour of being a finalist in the 2018 International Exhibition. As we painted, the watercolours were projected onto a huge screen behind the orchestra conducted by the artistic director, Jessica Kun, they played the selection of music which embraced cultural diversity as inspired by art and nature. Painting to the music, provided by the symphonies' expertise and passionate interpretation, was one of the most incredible and memorable experiences I have ever had!

IN MEMORIAM

JAKE MOL TWS, CSPWC (1935-2018)



All TWS members were saddened to hear of the passing of Jake Mol on Dec 6th 2018 after a valiant fight with cancer. He passed away peacefully at South Lake Hospital in Newmarket, surrounded by his family and his loving wife, TWS Lifetime member Pauline Holancin. Jake was, a good friend, volunteer and true gentleman to so many. He was an inspiration through his art and volunteerism to many artists both in TWS and throughout Ontario. A member of a number of other art organizations including: an elected member of the Canadian Society of Painters in Watercolour, 46 year member of East Central Ontario Art Association, Central Ontario Art Association, American Watercolour Society (associate) and charter member of the Vodka Painters of Canada where he received many awards for beautiful watercolours. Jake was a well respected teacher to so many students at the Haliburton School of the Arts, Blue Mountain Art School and many other art schools and organizations throughout Ontario. Over the years he also was called upon to jury and critique many art shows.

Jake (and Pauline) painted "en plein air" all over the world including: many states in the USA (especially Rockport Mass.), from coast to coast in Canada, New Zealand, and many countries in Europe. Wherever they went, they made many life time friends with other artists and the residents of the places they visited. For a number of years they took artists to Limoux, France for painting adventures as well as New Zealand. Jake shared his love of outdoor painting with TWS members by conducting many outdoor painting workshops in the GTA with our group.

But most of all, TWS members will remember Jake for being one of our ultimate volunteers in the history of this organization. Jake over his 34 years contributed to this group in numerous ways. Besides being part of the ever important technical crew that helped set-up, store and run our projection system. Jake was the official TWS auctioneer for holiday parties, and helped with the set up and take-down of every meeting that he has ever attended at TWS. He stored and transported the over -head mirror for our meetings (before the projection system) and helped with the set-up at almost every special workshop that TWS held. He carried in numerous amounts of paraphernalia for the TWS Holiday Party Skits, that were held over the years that Pauline organized for our members. He also helped to organize, clean up and load the dishwasher in their Tamarack Studios home, after many TWS parties, meetings and dinners that were held there. He was the consummate host! Through all, Jake has willingly contributed in numerous ways to the success of our meetings in ways that most members are not aware of. Much of the equipment ideas for projection of our monthly demonstrations were devised by Jake and are still being used today,

Jake received The TWS Volunteer of the Year Award in 2009, the Executive Volunteer of the Award for 10 years of service in executive positions in 2010, his 25 year member Pin and Certificate at our special Anniversary Dinner in 2009-10, and his Ontario Volunteer Service Award for his many years of service to the Arts in 2011.

For his participation and being juried into TWS shows, he was awarded a Silver Medal, a number of Award of Merits, a Signature Membership (SM), Bronze Level of Distinction S.M.(15 shows), Silver Level of Distinction S.M. (25 shows).

At the time of his passing, Jake had been juried into 33 shows, which probably would have been 50 if it had not been for Jake's stand to include watercolours coated with archival varnish and without glass. In his own self written obituary Jake wrote:" During the last 45 years I have been painting pure watercolours transparently. I attempted to improve the presentation of watercolours by providing permanent protection without the use of annoying reflective glass or other materials. I believe I succeeded in this effort." Yes Jake, you did! It is now permitted in our TWS show rules and is accepted in many other organizations. You have left quite a legacy that will forever affect the art world of watercolour for all your research and educating others of this possibility.

We will always remember Jake for being such a great passionate artist, innovator, volunteer, inspirational teacher, juror, beloved husband and partner to Pauline, loving family man to all your family, warm and caring host, a classy gentleman, and such a dear friend to so many in TWS and in all areas of your life (including me and my husband)

TWS was saddened to hear of the passing of Life Time Member Norma Heaver at the age of 91, on October 12th 2018. Norma joined TWS in 1986 and had been awarded her 25 year pin and certificate as well as her Signature Membership. Norma was born in Berlin, Germany, and grew up during the destruction and devastation caused by World War II. For six years she lived a frightened and hungry life until, as a young woman she met a handsome young Marine named Roy Heaver. They fell in love and, after special permission was granted for Norma to leave, she flew to England where they were married and lived happily for five years. However, after the birth of two sons in London, the Heaver family decided to immigrate to Canada where they finally settled in Scarborough, Ontario. Their cozy new home had enough land around it to allow Norma to indulge in her love of gardening so it wasn't long before the house was surrounded by gorgeous flowers, plants and trees. Norma reveled in the new surrounds, adored her young family and began, once again, to indulge her love of art.....painting colourful watercolours to grace the walls of their new home. As one of the earliest members of The Agincourt Garden Club, Norma served as President for many years, and also worked with a committee to award commendations to other beautiful gardens in the Scarborough Community, once a year. For over 50 years with the Agincourt Garden Club she was awarded a number of service awards for exhibiting and judging including a special Prestigious Service Award from the Ontario Horticultural Association in 2017. As well as being a member of the Toronto Watercolour Society, she was a long standing active member of the Art Guild of Scarborough where she served a 2 year term as President of The Art Guild of Scarborough in the 1980's. Her paintings were always much admired at their shows where she sold guite well. Norma Heaver was a kind, caring friend to many people and our memories of her will be cherished forever. There was No Service at her request. She leaves behind 2 sons and their families.




